Nemo Vista Elementary meets standards set by the Arkansas Department of Education. Nemo Vista Elementary has received a Public School Rating of a “B”. 2018 ESSA School Report indicates that 68.5 % of the 3-5 students are achieving in Literacy, which is up 2.2% from 2017-2018. The report also indicates that 73.0% of the 3-5 students are achieving in Math, which is down 1.26% from 2017-2018. We have shown growth the last two years in both areas.

Mission Statement: Every Child Every Chance

Enrollment: 228 Students K-5 (+ 24 Students)

Nemo Vista Elementary has grown 46 students in two years.

1. Comprehensive Assessment

- A. Renaissance Learning---A computerized assessment to assess early literacy skill, math skills and literacy skills in grades K-12.**
- B. iReady—A computerized assessment and intervention in literacy and math in grades K-8.**
- C. ACT Aspire---The ACT Aspire College and Career Readiness Solution a vertically-scaled assessment suite connected to The ACT®. This assessment will be given to grades 3rd-10th in Literacy, Math, and Science.**

2. Nemo Vista Elementary 2018-2019 School Improvement Plan will address the following:

- A. Reading Levels on the SQSS will increase 5% from 2017 to 2018.**
- B. Student Engagement Scores on the SQSS will increase 5% from 2017-2018.**
- C. Value-added growth scores will improve 10% from the 2017 ESSA School Index to the 2018 ESSA School Index.**

D. Science Achievement Economically Disadvantaged Student's Scores will increase 5% from the 2017 SQSS Science Achievement Scores to the 2018 SQSS Science Achievement Scores.

- 3. Retention: Nemo Vista has a retention rate of 1% in grades 1st through 5th.**
- 4. Transferring from an unsafe environment: Nemo Vista Elementary has a transferring rate of 0%.**
- 5. Transferring in pursuant of School Choice: Nemo Vista Elementary has transferred rate of 1%.**

Goals for 2018-2019 School Year:

- 1) To have every child in grades K-3 on reading grade level or have an action plan in place.**
- 2) To address the weak areas of our curriculum based on STAR Reading, STAR Math and ACT Aspire results from the 2017-2018 school year.**
- 3) To have an action plan for children who are considered at-risk.**
- 4) To identify homeless children and service their needs according to the McKinney-Vento Act.**
- 5) To actively involve parents in their children's education/Title I Program/and IRI's.**
- 6) Continue to align K-5 pacing guide to the Arkansas State Standards.**

Statements of Meeting Goals:

Based on the ACT Aspire spring testing scores, we were above the state and national average in all subject areas.
