

# Nemo Vista High School

Annual Public Report 2018-2019

**Nemo Vista High School meets standards set by the Arkansas Department of Education. The 2018 ESSA School Report indicates that 66% of students grades 9-10 are achieving in Literacy, this is an 11% increase from the 2016-2017 school year. The reports also indicates that 42% achievement in Math, a 9% increase from the previous school year, and 45% achievement in Science which was an 8% increase from the 2016-2017 school year. Nemo Vista High School received a letter grade of “A” on its school report card from the Arkansas Department of Education.**

## **Comprehensive Assessment:**

ACT Aspire---The ACT Aspire College and Career Readiness Solution a vertically-scaled assessment suite connected to The ACT®. This assessment will be given to 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students in Literacy, Math, and Science

ACT--- The ACT is a college readiness exam and will be given to all students in 11<sup>th</sup> grade

Renaissance Learning---A computerized assessment to assess early literacy skill, math skills and literacy skills in grades 9-10.

**Nemo Vista High School 2018-2019 School Improvement Plan will address:**

- In the 2018-2019 School year the number of students reading at grade level will increase by 10% compared to the 2017-2018 school year.
- In the 2018-2019 school year the number of students participating in extracurricular activities will increase by 10%.
- In the 2018-2019 school year the number of student absences will decrease by 5%
- In the 2018-2019 school year we will increase student opportunities college and career readiness.

**Goals for the 2018-2019 School Year:**

- Address curricular needs based on ACT Aspire results from the 2017-2018 school year.
- Develop action plans for students who are considered at-risk.
- Identify homeless children and service their needs according to the McKinney-Vento Act
- Actively involve parents in their children's education.
- Continue to increase concurrent credit opportunities for students
