Mission Statement: Success for tomorrow through education today.

ESSA Report:

- Nemo Vista High School meets standards set by the Arkansas Department of Education. Nemo Vista High School has received a Public School Rating of an “A”.
- Literacy Scores: 57.82% of the students are achieving, which is down 8.35% from 2017. However, our students outscored the state of Arkansas by 15.58%.
- Math Scores: 34.93% of the students are achieving, which is down 6.58% from 2017. Our students outscored the state by 2.66%.

Enrollment:

- Nemo Vista High School has 129 students.
- The student body is down 6 students from the year before.
- 1 freedom of choice into the district, 2 students freedom of choice out of the district
- 22 students taking concurrent courses at UACCM currently

Comprehensive Assessment

- Renaissance Learning---A computerized assessment to assess early literacy skill, math skills and literacy skills in grades K-12.
- ACT Aspire---The ACT Aspire College and Career Readiness Solution a vertically-scaled assessment suite connected to The ACT®. This assessment will be given to grades 3rd-10th in Literacy, Math, and Science.
- ACT-American College Test-standardized test to determine a high school graduate's preparation for college-level work. It covers four areas: English, mathematics, reading, and science reasoning. It is given to all 11th graders one time but is available to be taken more than once and by other grades as well.

School Improvement Plan:

- In the 2019-2020 School year the number of students reading at grade level will increase by 10% compared to the 2018-2019 school year.
- In the 2019-2020 school year the number of students performing at or above grade level in mathematics will increase by 10%.
- In the 2019-2020 school year the number of student to student discipline referrals will decrease by 5%.

Goals for 2019-2020 School Year:

- 1) To address the weak areas of our curriculum based on ACT Aspire/ACT results from the 2018-2019 school year.

- 2) To have an action plan for children who are considered at-risk.
- 3) To identify homeless children and service their needs according to the McKinney-Vento Act.
- 4) To actively involve parents in their children's education.
- 5) To actively involve grades 9-12 in career and college readiness programs.
- 6) To have Student Success Plans for all students in grades 9-12.
- 7) Continue to align 9th-12th grade pacing guides to the Arkansas State Standards.

Statements of Meeting Goals:

**Based on the ACT Aspire spring testing scores, we were above the state and national average in all subject areas except 9th grade math.
