

**Nemo Vista High School**  
**Public Meeting 2020-2021**  
**October 15, 2020**

**Mission Statement: Success for tomorrow through education today.**

**ESSA Report:**

- Nemo Vista High School meets standards set by the Arkansas Department of Education.
- Due to Covid-19 there was not an ESSA report for the 2019-2020 school year.
- All of these statements are based on 2018-2019 because we did not have any data from the 2019-2020 school year due to Covid-19.
  - Nemo Vista High School has received a Public School Rating of an “A”.
  - Literacy Scores: 57.82% of the students are achieving, which is down 8.35% from 2017. However, our students outscored the state of Arkansas by 15.58%.
  - Math Scores: 34.93% of the students are achieving, which is down 6.58% from 2017. Our students outscored the state by 2.66%.

**Enrollment:**

- Nemo Vista High School has 125 students.
- The student body is down 4 students from the year before.
- 1 freedom of choice into the district
- 17 students taking concurrent courses at UACCM currently
- 14 Virtual students which is down 11 from start of school year.

**Comprehensive Assessment**

- Renaissance Learning---A computerized assessment to assess early literacy skill, math skills and literacy skills in grades K-12.
- ACT Aspire---The ACT Aspire College and Career Readiness Solution a vertically-scaled assessment suite connected to The ACT®. This assessment will be given to grades 3rd-10th in Literacy, Math, and Science. The interims are given throughout the school year.
- ACT-American College Test-standardized test to determine a high school graduate's preparation for college-level work. It covers four areas: English, mathematics, reading, and science reasoning. It is given to all 11<sup>th</sup> graders one time but is available to be taken more than once and by other grades as well.

**Goals from 2019-2020 School Improvement Plan:**

- We were not able to determine if we achieved these goals due to the lack of data.

**School Improvement Plan:**

1. In the 2020-2021 School, 5% of the students will show growth pertaining to reading grade level equivalency.
2. In the 2020-2021 school year, the number of students performing at or above grade level in mathematics will increase by 5%.

3. In the 2020-2021 school year, the number of student to student discipline referrals will decrease by 5%.
4. In the 2020-2021 school year, students will have access to Canvas LMS regardless of their physical location.

**Goals for 2020-2021 School Year:**

- 1) To address the weak areas of our curriculum and students based on ACT results from 2019-2020, ACT Aspire results from 2018-2019 school year, ACT Aspire interims and STAR results from the 2020 school year due to not having ACT Aspire results from the 2019-2020 school year due to Covid-19.
- 2) Find ways to improve and increase student engagement for our virtual students.
- 3) To have an action plan for children who are considered at-risk.
- 4) To identify homeless children and service their needs according to the McKinney-Vento Act.
- 5) To actively involve parents in their children's education.
- 5) To actively involve grades 9-12 in career and college readiness programs.
- 6) To have Student Success Plans for all students in grades 9-12.
- 7) Continue to align 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade pacing guides to the Arkansas State Standards.

**Statements of Meeting Goals:**

\*\*Based on the ACT Aspire spring testing scores from the previous year, we were above the state and national average in all subject areas except 9<sup>th</sup> grade math, but due to Covid-19 and not ACT Aspire Testing in 2020 we do not know where we rank at this time in comparison to the state.
