

Nemo Vista Elementary
Public Meeting 2021-2022
October 25, 2021

Nemo Vista Elementary meets standards set by the Arkansas Department of Education. Previously, the Nemo Vista Elementary Public School Rating was a “B”. The Public School Rating System was suspended for the 2020-2021 school year by ACT 89 of 2021. 2021 ESSA School Report indicates that 47% of the 3-5 students are achieving in Literacy, which is down 5.8% from 2019. The report also indicates that 46% of the 3-5 students are achieving in Math, which is down 12.3% from 2019. Nemo Vista Elementary School did not test in the Spring of 2020 due to Covid-19.

Mission Statement: Every Child Every Chance

Enrollment: 245 Students K-5 (Up 6 students from 2021)

- 3 Classrooms each in Grade 1**
- 2 Classrooms each in Grades K, 2-5**

1. Comprehensive Assessment

- A. Renaissance Learning---A computerized assessment to assess early literacy skill, math skills and literacy skills in grades K-5.**
- B. NWEA—A computerized assessment to track progress in literacy and math in grades K-5.**
- C. Lexia---A computerized intervention in literacy in grade K-5**
- D. IXL---A computerized intervention in literacy and math in grades K-5**
- E. ACT Aspire---The ACT Aspire College and Career Readiness Solution a vertically- scaled assessment suite connected to The ACT®. This assessment will be given to grades 3rd-5th in Literacy, Math, and Science.**

2. Nemo Vista Elementary 2020-2021 School Improvement Plan addressed the following:

- A. Reading Levels on the SQSS will increase 5% from 2019 to 2021. The 2019 score was 58.33%. The ACT aspire was**

not given in the spring of 2020 due to Covid-19. The 2021 ACT aspire showed the SQSS reading scores were 43.01%. Nemo Vista Elementary dropped 15.2% from 2019.

B. Student Engagement Scores on the SQSS will increase 5% from 2019 to 2021. Engagement scores for 2019 were 70.92. The 2021 ACT aspire showed a score of 75%. Nemo Vista Elementary increased 4.08% from 2019 to 2021.

C. On the student survey: 65% of the students will feel no repercussions involving reporting bullying. There were only one true finding of bullying in the 2020-2021 school year.

3. Nemo Vista Elementary 2021-2022 School Improvement Plan will address the following:

A. Reading Levels on the SQSS will increase 5% from 2021 to 2022. The 2021 SQSS Reading at grade level was 43.01%. In 2022, Nemo Vista Elementary goal is 48.01%

B. Student Engagement on the SQSS will increase 5% 2021 to 2022. The 2021 SQSS Student Engagement was 75%. In 2022, Nemo Vista Elementary goal is 80%.

C. 75% of the students designated as scoring below the 50%tile on the Map testing in math will show growth through every testing period. The Fall 2021 score will be the baseline for this goal.

4. Retention: Nemo Vista has a retention rate of 0% in grades 1st through 5th.

5. Transferring from an unsafe environment: Nemo Vista Elementary has a transferred rate of 0%.

6. Transferring in pursuant of School Choice: Nemo Vista Elementary has a transferred rate of 0.9%.

Goals for 2021-2022 School Year:

- 1) To have every child in grades K-3 on reading grade level or have an action plan in place.**
- 2) To address the weak areas of our curriculum based on STAR Reading, STAR Math and NWEA results during the 2022 school year.**
- 3) To have an action plan for children who are considered at-risk.**
- 4) To identify homeless children and service their needs according to the McKinney-Vento Act.**
- 5) To actively involve parents in their children's education/Title I Program/and IRI's.**
- 6) To integrate new reading series grades K-5.**
- 7) Research adopting new math series grades K-5.**

Statements of Meeting Goals:

Based on the ACT Aspire scores, we were above the National Average or tied on all areas.

Based on the ACT Aspire scores, third grade was above the State average in all areas.

Fourth grade was below the state average in all areas except math.

Fifth grade was above the state average in all areas.

Based on the ESSA School Index report scores, we were above the state average in all areas except Caucasian students.
